



Finished quilt measures: 56" x 70"



Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.



Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

nine 7-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: eight 7-1/2" squares. forty-six 7-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles. one-hundred and twenty-eight 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" rectangles.

From each of Fabrics B and C, cut:

five 7-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: three 7-1/2" squares. ten 7-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles. sixty-eight 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" rectangles.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Assemble the A Blocks

Step 1: Gather one 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric A rectangle and two 7-1/2" x 3-1/2" Fabric B rectangles. Sew the two Fabric B rectangles to the long edges of the Fabric A rectangle, then press. Repeat to make three A/B A Blocks.

Step 2: Gather one 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric B rectangle and two 7-1/2" x 3-1/2" Fabric A rectangles. Sew the two Fabric A rectangles to the long edges of the Fabric B rectangle, then press. Repeat to make eight B/A A Blocks.

Step 3: Gather one 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric C rectangle and two 7-1/2" x 3-1/2" Fabric A rectangles. Sew the two Fabric A rectangles to the long edges of the Fabric C rectangle, then press. Repeat to make eight C/A A Blocks.

Step 4: Gather one 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric A rectangle and two 7-1/2" x 3-1/2" Fabric C rectangles. Sew the two Fabric C rectangles to the long edges of the Fabric A rectangle, then press. Repeat to make three A/C A Blocks.

Assemble the B Blocks

Step 5: Gather two 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric A rectangles, two 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric B rectangles, and one 7-1/2" x 3-1/2" Fabric B rectangle. Sew the two Fabric A rectangles to the long edges of the large Fabric B rectangle, then press. Sew the two smaller Fabric B rectangles to the long edges of the long edges of the unit, then press. Repeat to make four B/A B Blocks.

Step 6: Gather two 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric A rectangles, two 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric B rectangles, and one 7-1/2" x 3-1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Sew the two Fabric B rectangles to the long edges of the large Fabric A rectangle, then press. Sew the two smaller Fabric A rectangles to the long edges of the long edges of the unit, then press. Repeat to make seven A/B B Blocks.

Step 7: Gather two 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric A rectangles, two 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric C rectangles, and one 7-1/2" x 3-1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Sew the two Fabric C rectangles to the long edges of the large Fabric A rectangle, then press. Sew the two smaller Fabric A rectangles to the long edges of the long edges of the unit, then press. Repeat to make seven A/C B Blocks.

Step 8: Gather two 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric A rectangles, two 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric C rectangles, and one 7-1/2" x 3-1/2" Fabric C rectangle. Sew the two Fabric A rectangles to the long edges of the large Fabric C rectangle, then press. Sew the two smaller Fabric A rectangles to the long edges of the long edges of the unit, then press. Repeat to make four C/A B Blocks.



Assemble the C Blocks

Step 9: Gather three 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric A rectangles and four 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric B rectangles. Alternate the fabrics with one another so they are in B/A/B/A/B/A/B order. Sew the rectangles together along the edges, then press. Repeat to make five B/A C Blocks.

Step 10: Gather three 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric B rectangles and four 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric A rectangles. Alternate the fabrics with one another so they are in A/B/A/B/A/B/A order. Sew the rectangles together along the edges, then press. Repeat to make six A/B C Blocks.

Step 11: Gather three 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric C rectangles and four 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric A rectangles. Alternate the fabrics with one another so they are in A/C/A/C/A order. Sew the rectangles together along the edges, then press. Repeat to make six A/C C Blocks.

Step 12: Gather three 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric A rectangles and four 7-1/2" x 1-1/2" Fabric C rectangles. Alternate the fabrics with one another so they are in C/A/C/A/C/A/C order. Sew the rectangles together along the edges, then press. Repeat to make five C/A C Blocks.


Assemble the Quilt

Step 13: Arrange the blocks and 7-1/2" squares into ten rows of eight blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 14: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the odd-numbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.

Step 15: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!



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
