



BASIC Table Topper #7 - Version 1

Featuring Garden Gate Roosters

Please read all instructions carefully AND identify all fabrics before beginning. All instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance and strips are cut selvage to selvage, unless stated otherwise.

1. Cut the following:

If using FAT CUTS, you may need to cut additional width-of-fabric strips.

Fabric A - Referring to the guilt image, fussy cut strips, the length of fabric parallel to selvage: (4) 5-1/2" x 64" stripe borders

Fabric B - Cut (5) 2" strips, sewn together end to end and cut into (2) 2" x 51-1/2" and (2) 2" x 48-1/2" borders

Fabric C - Cut (1) 8-7/8" strip, subcut (4) 8-7/8" squares then cut in half diagonally for 🥢 8 triangles

Cut (1) 3-1/4" strip, subcut (2) 3-1/4" x 16-1/2" strips

Cut (7) 2-1/2" strips (binding)

Fabric D - Cut (1) 17-1/4" strip, subcut (1) 17-1/4" square then cut in half diagonally twice for 4 triangles

Fabric E - Cut (1) 8-1/2" strip, subcut (4) 8-1/2" squares

Fabric F - Cut (1) 17-1/4" strip, subcut (1) 17-1/4" square then cut in half diagonally twice for 4 triangles. Cut remaining strip into (2) 8-1/2" x 20" strips, subcut (4) 8-1/2" squares.

Cut (1) 8-7/8" strip, subcut (4) 8-7/8" squares then cut in half diagonally for 8 triangles

Fabrics G and H - From each fabric:


Cut (1) 8-7/8" strip, subcut (4) 8-7/8" squares then cut in half diagonally for 8 triangles

Fabric I - PLEASE NOTE: Panels do not always print the size intended. For this pattern, the panel has a coping border added to top and bottom of panel then trimmed so they will fit the quilt correctly.

Cut 1 placemat to 16-1/2" wide. Trim top and bottom edges to 1/4" outside of placemat panel to approximately 11-1/2" tall.

2. Piecing Order:

1. Sew 3-1/4" x 16-1/2" Fabric C strips on top and bottom edges of the **Fabric I** placemat panel. Trim bordered panel to 16-1/2" square (unfinished) to complete Block 1.



Block 1 - Make 1

Arrows indicate orientation of directional prints when used.

2. Sew **Fabric G** 8-7/8" triangles to short edges of a Fabric F 17-1/4" triangle as shown. Make a total of 4 Unit 1 (8-1/2" x 16-1/2" unfinished). In the same manner, make 1 each Units 2a-2d with fabrics indicated.





3. Sew a Unit 1 to each of Units 2a-2d as shown. Make a total of 1 each Blocks 2a-2d (16-1/2" square unfinished).

4. Stitch 1 each **Fabrics F** and **H** 8-7/8" triangles together along their long edges. Make a total of 8 Unit 3 (8-1/2" square unfinished).



5. Arrange 2 Unit 3 and 1 each **Fabrics E** and **F** 8-1/2" squares in 2 rows. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together. Make a total of 4 **Block 3** (16-1/2" square unfinished).




- 6. Refer to Quilt Layout (Page 3) for arrangement and placement of blocks and borders.
- 7. Arrange blocks in 3 rows. Stitch into rows. Sew rows together completing quilt center (48-1/2" square unfinished).
- 8. Sew **Fabric B** 2" x 48-1/2" borders to right and left sides of quilt center. Add **Fabric B** 2" x 51-1/2" borders to top and bottom of quilt center.
- 9. Center **Fabric A** 5-1/2" x 64" borders on all sides of quilt center with top edge next to quilt center.

 Stitch borders to sides starting and stopping 1/4" from corners of quilt center.

 Do not trim. Press borders out.

Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric. Arrows indicate orientation of directional prints. 10. Working with 1 corner at a time, fold the quilt right sides together so the outside edges of the borders line up. Using a 45-degree ruler, mark from the end of border seams to outer edges of borders. Stitch along marked line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press corner seam open. Repeat on remaining corners.



- 11. The quilt measures approximately 61-1/2" square (unfinished). Make backing (**Fabric J**) approximately 8" larger than the top.
- 12. Layer and baste top, batting, and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (**Fabric C**) and enjoy!!
