Garden Gate Roosters

Please read all instructions carefully AND identify all fabrics before beginning.

All instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance and strips are cut selvage to selvage, unless stated otherwise.

1. Cut the following for Table Topper:

- **Fabric A** Referring to the quilt image, fussy cut (4) 11-1/2" tall x 16-1/2" wide pieces, centering the pictures
- **Fabric B** Referring to the quilt image, fussy cut strips, the length of fabric parallel to selvage: (4) 9" x 63" stripe borders
- Fabric C Cut (1) 12" strip, subcut (2) 11-7/8" squares [then cut in half diagonally for 4 triangles], (2) 3" x 16-1/2" pieces and (2) 3" x 11-1/2" pieces
- **Fabric F** Cut (4) 2" strips, subcut (4) 2" x 38-1/2" borders
- **Fabric G** Cut (7) 2-1/2" strips, sewn together end to end (binding)
- Cut (2) 1-1/2" strips, subcut (4) 1-1/2" x 16-1/2" pieces
- Cut (1) 2" strip, subcut (4) 2" squares
- Fabrics H and I From each fabric, cut (3) 2" strips, subcut (6) 2" x 8-3/4" pieces and (6) 2" x 7-1/4" pieces

Not all Fabrics D and E triangles will be used.

2. Piecing Order for Table Topper:

1. Sew a **Fabric I** 2" x 7-1/4" piece to one short side of a **Fabric D** triangle as shown. Then sew a **Fabric I** 2" x 8-3/4" piece to the other short side of the **Fabric D** triangle for Unit 1. Make 2 Unit 1.





2. Sew a **Fabric I** 2" x 7-1/4" piece to one short side of a **Fabric D** triangle as shown. Then sew a **Fabric I** 2" x 8-3/4" piece to the other short side of the **Fabric D** triangle for Unit 2. Make 4 Unit 2.





3. In the same manner as Unit 1, use **Fabrics E** and **H** to make 4 Unit 3.




4. In the same manner as Unit 2, use **Fabrics E** and **H** to make 2 Unit 4.



5. Sew Unit 1 to Unit 4 as shown to make Unit 5. Make 2 Unit 5.



6. Sew Unit 2 to Unit 3 as shown to make Unit 6. Make 4 Unit 6.



7. Sew long edges of 2 Unit 6 together as shown. Trim to 11-1/2" square to make Center Unit.



8. Sew **Fabric C** 3" x 11-1/2" pieces to sides of Center Unit, and **Fabric C** 3" x 16-1/2" pieces to top and bottom of Center Unit to make Bordered Center (16-1/2" square unfinished).




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9. Press (4) **Fabric G**1-1/2" x 16-1/2" pieces in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Lay folded strips on Bordered Center, matching raw edges, and baste 1/8" from edge to complete **Block A** (16-1/2" square unfinished).




10. Matching centers, sew together long edges of **Fabric C** 11-7/8" triangle and Unit 5. Trim Unit 5 to make an 11-1/2" square (unfinished) for **Block B**. Make 2 **Block B**.

11. In the same manner sew **Fabric C** triangle to Unit 6 and trim to 11-1/2" square (unfinished) for **Block C**. Make 2 **Block C**.


- 12. Referring to layout on page 3, arrange 4 **Fabric A** 11-1/2" x 16-1/2" pieces, 2 each **Blocks B** and **C** and 1 **Block A** into 3 rows. Sew into rows, then sew rows together (38-1/2" square unfinished).
- 13. Sew 2 **Fabric F** 2" x 38-1/2" borders to sides of pieced square. Sew **Fabric G** 2" squares to each end of the remaining **Fabric F** 2" x 38-1/2" borders, then sew borders to the top and bottom of square to complete topper center (41-1/2" square unfinished).

14. Center **Fabric B** 9" x 63" borders on right and left sides and on top and bottom of quilt center with red stripe toward the outside.

Stitch borders to sides, starting and stopping 1/4" from corners of topper center. Do not trim. Press borders out.

Arrows indicate orientation of directional print. Letters in italics indicate wrong side of fabric.

15. Working with 1 corner at a time, fold the topper right sides together so the outside edges of the borders line up. Using a 45-degree ruler, mark from the end of border seams to outer edges of borders. Stitch along marked line. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press corner seam open. Repeat on remaining corners.




- 16. The table topper measures approximately 58-1/2" square (unfinished). Make backing (**Fabric J**) approximately 8" larger than the top.
- 17. Layer and baste top, batting, and backing together. Quilt as desired. Attach binding (**Fabric G**) and enjoy!!
